# **Caterpillar Employee Blood Drives**

Caterpillar and the American Red Cross have a very long-standing partnership in the effort to collect blood. As stated on the American Red Cross website, the "American Red Cross Biomedical Services plays a critical role in our nation's health care system. It is the largest single supplier of blood and blood products in the United States, collecting and processing more than 40 percent of the blood supply and distributing it to some 3,000 hospitals and transfusion centers nationwide. The Red Cross also plays a leading role in protecting the safety of donors and patients and increasing the availability of blood. It has been among the first to help develop and implement testing for infectious diseases and is frequently the single major contributor to clinical trials to improve blood safety. Providing life-saving blood and blood products to patients is a key component of the Red Cross mission to help people in times of emergency and disasters.

The American Red Cross empowers ordinary people to perform extraordinary acts of service. Our blood donors are ordinary people from every walk of life. They share one thing – a generous spirit, a desire to give back to their community and help others. Blood donors play an integral role in the delivery of modern healthcare. Many life-saving medical treatments and procedures involve blood transfusions and would not be possible without a safe and reliable blood supply."




Front Row (left to right): Louis LaCost, President; Mary Remmers, 1st First Vice President: Kathy Inman, Second Vice President
