## NEVADA PROCUREMENT CODE

Fiscal Year End: June 30

- 1. **Prequalifications:** None.
- 2. Auto-drop: None
- 3. **Life Cycle Costing (LCC):** Evaluations based on LCC may be allowed in order to determine the lowest responsible bidder.
  - a. NRS 333.140 → The Chief, in all his or her purchasing and property control activities, shall pursue a policy of securing the best value for supplies, materials, equipment and services
- 4. Piggybacking: Allowed.
  - a. NAC 333.175.1 → A using agency may participate in the award of a contract on a multistate basis if:
    - 1. NAC 333.175.1.c→ Participation in the award of the contract on a multistate basis is in the best interest of the State of Nevada as determined by the chief
- 5. **Recycle Preferences:** Products which contain postconsumer waste (at least 50% of the product's weight) are given a ten percent (10%) price preference.
  - a. NRS 333.4606.2 → When purchasing goods and products for the using agencies, the Chief shall give preference to recycled products if:
    - i. The product meets the applicable standards;
    - ii. The product can be substituted for a comparable nonrecycled product; and
    - iii. The product costs no more than a comparable nonrecycled product.
  - b. NRS333.4606.4 → To encourage the use of postconsumer waste, a bidder who manufactures a product in Nevada that contains postconsumer waste shall be deemed to be the lowest bidder if:
    - 1. At least 50 percent of the product, by weight, contains postconsumer waste;
    - ii. The product complies with the applicable standards; and
    - iii. The amount of the bid is not more than 10 percent higher than the bid of any other bidder.
  - c. NRS 333.4606.5 → A bidder whose product contains postconsumer waste shall certify in writing:
    - i. That the product contains postconsumer waste; and
    - ii. The percentage of postconsumer waste, by weight, that is contained in the product.
