MANITOBA PROCUREMENT CODE

Fiscal Year End: March 31

- 1. Prequalification: Source lists allowed, but can register anytime.
 - a. AIT 506.2.C \rightarrow The Use of source list are allowed, provided that:
 - i. Registration on the source list is consistent with Article 504;
 - ii. All registered suppliers in a given category are invited to respond to all call for tenders in that category; and
 - iii. A supplier that meets the conditions for registration on the source list is able to register at any time.
 - AIT 504.6 → Except as otherwise required to comply with international obligations, a Party may limit its tendering to Canadian goods or suppliers, subject to the following conditions: (a) the procuring Party must be satisfied that there is sufficient competition among Canadian suppliers; (b) all qualified suppliers must be informed through the call for tenders of the existence of the preference and the rules applicable to determine Canadian content; and (c) the requirement for Canadian good.

2. Auto-Drop: None.

- 3. Life Cycle Costing: Allowed if written in the ITB.
 - a. AIT 506.6 → In evaluating tenders, a Party may take into account not only the submitted price but also quality, quantity, delivery, servicing, the capacity of the supplier to meet the requirements of the procurement and any other criteria directly related to the procurement that are consistent with Article 504. The tender documents shall clearly identify the requirements of the procurement, the criteria that will be used in the evaluation of bids and the methods of weighting and evaluating the criteria.
- 4. Piggybacking: Not mentioned
- 5. Recycle Preference: Encouraged
 - a. MB SDPG C.3 → [The following sustainable development procurement guidelines apply to the Government of Manitoba and shall be considered in any procurement.]
 Conserving resources which means (a) evaluating and reducing the need to purchase goods, materials and services; (b) purchasing goods, materials and services that use recycled products; (c) purchasing goods and materials with structures that require less material to manufacture; (d) purchasing goods and materials that require less packaging; and (e) reusing, recycling and recovering goods and materials.
- 6. Minority/ Small/ Disadvantage Business Enterprise Preference: None.
