INDIANA PROCUREMENT CODE

Fiscal Year End: June 30

- 1. Pre-qualifications: None.
- 2. Auto-drop: None.
- 3. Life Cycle Costing (LCC): Evaluations based on LCC are acceptable if it is one of the evaluation criteria stated in the IFB.
 - a. IC 5-22-7.3-3 \rightarrow Evaluation criteria that will: (1) affect the bid price; and (2) be considered in the evaluation for an award; must be objectively measurable.
 - b. IC 5-22-7.4 → Only criteria specified in the invitation for bids may be used in bid evaluation.
- 4. Piggybacking: Allowed.
 - a. IC 5-22-10-15.a \rightarrow A purchasing agent may purchase supplies if the purchase is made from a person who has a contract with a federal agency and the person's contract with the federal agency requires the person to make the supplies available to the state or political subdivisions.
 - b. IC 5-22-10-15. b → A purchasing agent for a political subdivision may purchase supplies if the purchase is made from a person who has a contract with a state agency and the person's contract with the state requires the person to make the supplies or services available to political subdivisions, as provided in IC 4-13-1.6 or IC 5-22-17-9
- 5. **Recycle Preferences:** Price preferences for products made from recycled materials must be between 10% and 15%, with the exact percentage preference determined by one of the three methods stated in part C.
 - a. IC 5-22-15-16 →
 - i. This section does not apply when the purchase description is limited to a supply that meets the description set forth in subsection (b).
 - ii. There is a price preference for supplies that contain recycled materials or postconsumer materials.
 - iii. The amount of the price preference and the recycled materials' composition of the supplies must be set by one (1) of the following:
 - A. (1) Rules adopted by the governmental body.
 - B. (2) Policies established by the purchasing agency.
 - C. (3) The solicitation. The preference shall be set to maximize the use of recycled materials when economically practical.
 - iv. A price preference set under subsection (c) may not be less than ten percent (10%) or exceed fifteen percent (15%).

- 6. **Minority/Small/Disadvantaged Business Enterprise preferences:** Certain solicitations may be set aside for small business participation only.
 - a. IC 5-22-14-4.a \rightarrow A governmental body that has adopted rules under this chapter may identify as a small business set-aside specific supplies for which purchase has been requested under this article

b. IC 5-22-14-4.b → A small business designation must be made before the solicitation for the purchase is issued and the public notice of the purchase must state that the purchase is a small business set-aside
