Fiscal Year End: June 30

- 1. Prequalifications: None.
- 2. Auto-drop: None.
- 3. Life Cycle Costing (LCC): Evaluations based on LCC are allowed.
 - a. UPC 63G-6-401.5.b.i → Bids shall be evaluated based on the requirements set forth in the invitation for bids, which may include criteria to determine acceptability such as inspection, testing, quality, workmanship, delivery, and suitability for a particular purpose.
 - b. UPC 63G-6-401.5.b.ii → Those criteria that will affect the bid price and be considered in evaluation for award shall be objectively measurable
 - c. UPC 63G-6-401.5.b.iii → The criteria may include discounts, transportation costs, and total or life cycle costs

4. Piggybacking: Allowed.

- a. UPC 63G-6-901 → Under the terms agreed upon among the parties, any public procurement unit may enter into agreements with one or more other public procurement units to:
 - i. sponsor, conduct, or administer a cooperative agreement for the procurement or disposal of any supplies, services, or construction

5. Recycle Preferences: Consider recycled items

- a. $63G-6-403 \rightarrow$ The procurement officer or other person responsible for purchasing supplies for each public procurement unit shall:
 - i. comply with Section 63G-6-406; and
 - ii. (a) maintain for reference a copy of the current listing of recycled items available on state contract as issued by the chief procurement officer under Section 63G-6-204; and
 - (b) give recycled items consideration when inviting bids and purchasing supplies.
- b. 63G-6-406 (2) → Notwithstanding Section 63G-6-401, which requires public procurement units to purchase products from the lowest responsible bidder, and subject to Subsection (3), every public procurement unit shall give preference to the purchase of paper and paper products which are manufactured or produced from recycled materials.
