TOPIC: How To Improve Safety With Signs

Signs are an important part of communicating hazards, but they are often overlooked or ignored.

Visibility

- Workers should be able to see signs both night and day.
- Signs should always be legible.
- Signs should be maintained and clear of debris or anything that could obstruct visibility.
- Do not overwhelm the mine site with signs.
- Remove signs when not needed.

Understanding

- Signs should have clear, concise messages that are appropriate to all workers.
- Ensure containers are labeled with appropriate information.
