We manufacture and repair traction motors at our Sete Lagoas, Minas Gerais facility. We also manufacture new locomotives including our EMD SD70ACe locomotive in our facility located at Sete Lagoas. At our facility in Hortolandia, San Paulo we rebuild and overhaul older locomotives. Our Curitiba location provides electronic systems to remotely monitor and service the locomotives.

Progress Rail has contributed to the regional economic growth in these regional locations. The installation of our facilities in Brazil collaborated with the development of new component supplier for the local rail market. This boosted the region directly and indirectly, as well as provided social benefits, such as employee training and education. These facilities are assisting in improving the availability and reliability of locomotives and, subsequently increasing the capacity of railroad transportation in Brazil.
