## **☑** CREATE RECOGNIZABLE BOUNDARIES

- Help workers recognize patterns in operating systems for all onsite heavy equipment
- Clearly define the boundaries of all work zones, paying special attention to areas where the work zones intersect and overlap

## **☑** COMMUNICATION TRAINING

Train employees on the importance of jobsite communication, such as:

- Keeping track of others in the work zone and letting them know where you are at all times
- Establishing eye contact with co-workers before entering their work zones
- Making sure there is two-way communication whenever it is necessary to enter a work zone
- Never entering another person's work zone until the employee active in that zone acknowledges your presence
- Always informing coworkers when you leave their work zones
