HOW TO IMPROVE SAFETY WITH SIGNS

- VISIBILITY**
 - Workers should be able to see signs both night and day
 - Signs should always be legible
 - Signs should be maintained and cleared of debris
 - Signs should have unobstructed view
 - Do not overwhelm the mine site with signs
 - Remove signs when not needed

- UNDERSTANDING**
 - Signs should have clear, concise messages that are appropriate to all workers
 - Ensure containers are labeled with appropriate information
