PROTECTING THE PUBLIC

SAFETY TIPS

- Keep the jobsite fenced off to prevent unwanted access
- Maintain any fences or barriers on a regular schedule
- Place barriers before all road entrances to the site and adequately light the entrances
- Ensure there is enough clearance around a jobsite to protect people from falling material
- When work has stopped for the day, make sure:
 - The boundary is secure
 - All ladders are removed or their rungs boarded
 - All excavations and openings are securely covered or fenced off
 - All mobile equipment is immobilized to prevent unauthorized use
 - Bricks and other materials are safely stacked
 - Flammable or hazardous substances, tools and other materials are locked away in secure storage locations
- If the jobsite is abandoned or the work has ceased, be sure to leave it in a safe condition

DEVELOP A COMMUNICATION PROGRAM

- Create videos, brochures and advertisements that help teach mature decision-making
- Work with area schools and agencies to teach people about your jobsite
- Communicate to the public that your jobsite protects the health and safety of everyone, not just the workers
- Maintain good community relationships. Building bridges can be a big help in protecting your jobsite, as well as protecting the public
