Our Caterpillar Precision Seals employees cast, grind and finish more than 300,000 seal groups annually, ranging in diameter from 2" up to 37" for Caterpillar, Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) and defense industry customers all over the world.

OUR PRODUCTS

The Mapleton facility can melt up to 1,000 tons of iron daily to produce products that include:

- C175, 3500 and 3600 engine platforms
- Cylinder heads, liners, flywheel housings, and engine attachments
- Cat Seals (Duo Cone™ and Heavy-Duty Dual Face) ranging in sizes from 3" to 37")
