SURF'S UP AT THE RITZ-CARLTON, LAGUNA NIGUEL'S ANNUAL SURFING SANTA CONTEST AND HOLIDAY SURFBOARD AUCTION THIS NOVEMBER

Both events continue to benefit Surfers Healing, the original surf camp for children with autism

DANA POINT, Calif. – October 8, 2019 – In the spirit of giving, The Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel kicks off the holiday season with the **Annual Surfing Santa and Stand Up Paddle Board Contest** at Salt Creek Beach in Dana Point on Saturday, November 23 and Sunday, November 24, 2019. Following, the resort will host the **Annual Holiday Surfboard Auction** from Saturday, November 23 until December 31, 2019, featuring a variety of artistry surfboards by celebrated artists, creatives and iconic shapers such as Wyland, Firewire, and Chad Smith, lead drummer of the Red Hot Chili Peppers. With the hotel's commitment to supporting worthy causes, both seasonal events benefit Surfers Healing, a non-profit who provides children with autism the gift of surfing. In 2018, the resort raised over \$44,000 for the charity, with a total donation of \$390,000 since collaborating with the non-profit 11 years ago.

"Every year, we anticipate these special events, continuing to elevate our annual tradition by connecting with our local community in a meaningful way and raising more funds for Surfers Healing," says Bruce Brainerd, General Manager of The Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel. "It's an honor to see our mission of giving back to children with autism lived out for the past 11 years with so much support from locals, artists, and creatives. We could not make such an impactful difference without them."

The Surfing Santa and Stand Up Paddle Board Contest is a two-day event where contestants dress as Santa or other holiday-inspired characters and battle it out in the waves on Saturday, November 23 and Sunday, November 24 at Salt Creek Beach, located directly below the resort and known as one of the best surfing destinations in Southern California. The contest features 10 divisions, inclusive of surf, stand up paddle board, and body board – available for both children and adults. Each heat extends prizes for placed winners, and all participants are eligible for a \$2,000 Big Air prize, based on contestable air points throughout the day. A \$500 1st Place Costume prize, a \$200 2nd Place Costume prize (must be dressed in costume to qualify), and a \$1,000 Fastest Stand Up Paddle Board prize are also awarded. Contestants can register at www.surfingsantacontest.org. Registration ends on Monday, November 18, 2019. Locals and guests are invited to attend and cheer on the contestants.

The **Holiday Surfboard Auction** from Saturday, November 23 to Tuesday, December 31, 2019 highlights a selection of stunning surfboards from celebrated creatives, renowned artists and iconic shapers, on display at the resort and auctioned online to benefit Surfers Healing. Donated surfboards include works by artists such as **Wyland**, Juliet Gilden, and Nicholas Kontaxis; musicians like **DJ Steve Aoki** and **Red Hot Chili Peppers' drummer Chad Smith**; along with shapers such as **Firewire**, **Ellis Surfboards**, and **Brawner Boards**. The boards are on display in the oceanfront resort's lobby throughout the entire holiday season and bids can be placed online at <u>Bidding for Good</u> starting Saturday, November 23, 2019.

Brainerd developed the Surfing Santa and Stand Up Paddle Board Contest and Holiday Surfboard Auction as a way to connect and pay homage to Dana Point's iconic surf history. As some may know, Hobie opened in 1958 as the first California surf shop on Pacific Coast Highway in Dana Point, revolutionizing the surfboard industry and birthing the ocean sport lifestyle that has become a backbone of the local community. As a way to continue honoring the city's surf heritage, The Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel debuted the first Surfboard Auction in 2008, raising more than \$13,000, and two years later, the resort hosted the first Surfing Santa Contest.
