

## Portfolio 1 3/8" Adjustable Single Bracket Installation Instructions

#### 13/8" Adjustable Single Bracket

Thank you for purchasing your new Paris Texas Hardware™ Brackets. Proper installation of the brackets will provide you with many years of beauty and trouble free use. Clean with a soft cloth. Do not use harsh or abrasive cleaning supplies or polishes which may damage the finish.


#### Components Included for each Bracket

#### Tools Needed for Installation (not included)

- · Tape Measure
- · Phillips screwdriver
- Pencil
- $\cdot$  Drill with  $^3/_{16}$ " drill bit to pre-drill
- · Level (recommended)
- for plastic expansion anchors




### Tips for Successful Installation

Securely attach all Brackets to the mounting surface. If you do not locate and install into wood studs, use the proper wall fasteners and / or plastic anchors designed for your particular mounting surface (fasteners are included). When drilling into metal, use self-tapping screws (not included).

Make certain all Brackets line up evenly by measuring their placement.

#### 1 3/8" Adjustable Single Bracket Installation

1. Locate correct anchors for your wall type.



IMPORTANT: We suggest always installing brackets into wall studs for added security. If not installing into wall studs, be sure to use appropriate fasteners for your wall type.

Based on length of pole, width of window and position of wall studs, determine the desired height and width. Be certain to make the appropriate allowance for the decorative hardware. It is recommended that the Bracket be installed approximately 2" or more inches beyond the window frame.

- 2. Based on length of drapery and installation method (ring, ring with clip or rod pocket), establish distance of bracket from floor, using the template on the next page as a guide.
- 3. Once template position is established, locate cross-hairs that indicate screw placement. Firmly press pencil into cross-hairs and through paper, leaving a slight mark on the wall.
- 4. Drill a pilot hole (B) into screw placement marks. See Figure 1 on page 2. If not drilling into studs, remember to use fasteners appropriate for your wall type.
- 5. Place bracket (A) over holes (B) and drill screws (C) through the front of the bracket. NOTE: if the bracket is not flush against the wall, slightly back out the screws and redrill until the bracket fits securely against the wall.
- 6. While holding the second bracket in position on the opposite side of the window, place the pole in both cradles. Use a level to find the best height for the second bracket.
- 7. Once the pole is level, lightly mark the position of the second bracket on the wall.
- Place the template into position and repeat steps 3-7. Use the same method for center support brackets.
