Rowley project list: Crib Bedding

Crib bedding is now a much regulated area, different state by state. Before selling / fabricating any crib bedding be sure to check your state regulations for approved content.

CRIB BEDDING: STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS

Our crib project includes a duvet cover and a bed skirt, made to fit our specific crib. All measurements given fit our project only. The duvet finished out at 51" x 27". The skirt was made detachable from the decking, covered three sides only and finished 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide for the front, 27 $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide for the sides and all 16 $\frac{1}{4}$ " long. For detailed step-by-step instructions on fabricating the mattress cover, see the Project Guide titled Changing Table Pads.

Crib Duvet:

Cutting and Prepping the pieces:

- Cut the front and back fabric 53" x 29" to allow for take-up once the insert is inserted.
- Cut and make enough welt cord to go around the front, plus a few inches for joining.





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- Glue-baste the welt to the front, making relief cuts at the corners.
- Sew welt to front, making the join at the machine.



- Cut a chain of invisible zipper 56". Add the zipper pull to one end.
- Mark the back of the zipper chain for a start and stop sewing placement.
- Make coordinating marks on the bottom of the front, marking within the seam allowances.





Putting In the Zipper:

- On the top, open the zipper and pin one side to the front, matching marks.
- Use a cording foot to sew on the zipper to the side with the welt; use a zipper or skinny foot to sew on the side without the welt.
- Test zipper to be sure you have not sewn to close to the teeth.







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- Close the zipper all but a few inches.
- Sew across the zipper chain at the top and bottom to close off the zipper.
- Place right sides of front and back together and sew the remaining seam on either end of the zipper.
- Clip off any excess chain.



Finishing the Duvet:

- Finish sewing the front to the back.
- With the duvet still inside out, mark for insert snap placements.
- Sew on duvet snaps.
- Snap on insert.
- Turn right sides out, close zipper and fluff.




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Crib Skirt:

You will have three panels (two sides and a front), four overlays with welt cord detail and a detachable decking for this project.

Making the Decking:

- Cut decking material 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 31 $\frac{1}{4}$ " to finish at 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 27 $\frac{3}{4}$ ".
- At the top (one long side) turn under and press a double 1 ½" hem.
- At the other three sides, turn under and press a double $\frac{1}{2}$ " hem.
- Top stitch all hems, mitering corners if you wish.








Sew strips of 2" hook to the three sides with the small side hems.

Making the Panels and Overlays:

- Cut three pieces of face fabric, matching patterns, at 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x the width of the fabric.
- Cut two widths to 34", but leave the third width as is.
- From the left-overs, cut 2 overlays at 10 ¼" and 2 at 11".
- On each bottom, turn under and press a double 1 ½" hem.
- Pin lining to panel and pin lining to overlays.
- Sew pieces together, sewing along the first press line (at 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ").
- Fold right sides out and press hem toward face fabric.










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




- \bigcirc Open each panel piece, match tops with right sides together and sew side seams using $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance.
- Turn right sides out and re-press.
- On each overlay, add a row of micro-welt to the side seam before sewing.









- Find the finished width of each panel, measuring from the center out.
- Turn excess width to the back to form a half-pleat on each side.
- Mark the finished length on all panels and overlays.
- Place overlays on panels and sew together, sewing within the seam allowance or above the finished length marks.

Making the Waistbands:

- Cut one waistband per panel about 7" x the width plus 2".
 - A. You will need one waistband per panel for a total of three.
- Fold in half lengthwise and crease.
- Fold in and iron in ½" seam allowances along all long edges.



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- Sew a strip of 2" loop tape to one long side of each prepared panel, sewing through one thickness of fabric only.
- Fold waistband right sides together and sew short sides.
- Place right side (non-looped) of waistband against the right side of the panel.
- Sew along finished length marks to join.
- Turn waistband to back and hand close.
